PASTOR'S ARTICLE (CONTINUED)

best we can. But this has not happened on accident. The world does not operate by random chance. We are more than just biological machines living inside a much larger machine. God is at work! God has a plan! The providential hand of God has led you our way, and I hope you see and acknowledge it. "The heart of man plans his way, but the LORD establishes his steps" (Proverbs 16:9).

- 2. **SEEK.** The second action item is to keep seeking God by hearing and learning about His truth and mercy. Keep coming to hear God's Word preached. Go home and read God's Word. Everything in the Bible teaches us God's will and brings us into a relationship with Jesus. The way to build a relationship with a friend is to spend time with them and speak with them. The way to seek God is to spend time with Him, listening to Him through the Bible, and speaking to Him through prayer. Do not try to map the whole thing out first, but rather, seek God in His Word and trust in Him to guide you. "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Psalm 119:105).
- 3. **ASK.** You probably have questions about the Bible, Christianity, salvation, or our church. That is normal, and we are here to help. Feel free to ask your questions or request help. Our contact information is on the back of the bulletin, but you can talk to us in person as well. The most important thing is to seek God with a sincere heart. God promises, "You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all vour heart" (Jeremiah 29:13). And the Bible urges, "Seek the LORD while he may be found; call upon him while he is near; ⁷ let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; let him return to the LORD, that he may have compassion on him, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon" (Isaiah 55:6–7).
- 4. **EXPERIENCE.** Keep coming to the church's worship and other events to experience the community of faith in an up-close-and-personal, real, and tangible way. North Harford Baptist Church is here to be an oasis of truth, love, and kindness -- a refuge of sorts. This is where you can learn to live for God based on the Bible, not tradition. You will not be manipulated or exploited, but loved and respected. We are not here for our own glory or popularity, but for God's glory and the spiritual well-being of whoever comes our way. God's will for you is to be saved, join the church, and live for Jesus in all areas of life. I know we live in a culture of hyper-individualism, but I encourage you to take full advantage of the blessings of "the household of God, which is the church of the living God, a pillar and buttress of the truth" (1 Timothy 3:15).

HOW TO SEEK GOD
