PASTOR'S ARTICLE (CONTINUED)

from a relationship with God and keeps us from falling into despair and cynicism. When Jesus arrived, He made true and lasting joy possible and accessible to restless and weary sinners. You can have joy today if you look to Jesus as the living fountain of God's help and kindness. "Though you have not seen him, you love him. Though you do not now see him, you believe in him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, ⁹ obtaining the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls" (1 Peter 1:8-9).

- 3. **Peace** Peace means an inner sense of contentment of heart and an abiding experience of genuine rest for the soul. It is easy to be overwhelmed by the angst and uneasiness of the world. It is easy to be swept up in the "alwayswanting-more" spirit of the culture. But when Jesus arrived, He modeled and made possible the way of peace in fellowship with God. This Advent season, be sure to find peace in Christ rather than things and traditions. "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).
- 4. *Hope Hope means the certainty of our future inher*itance of heavenly glory and resurrection life. Despite everything the world says, THIS LIFE is not the end. THIS WORLD is not all there is. After we die, our souls will depart to be with Christ, free from the sin, sorrow, and sufferings of this world. When Christ arrives to the world for the second and final time, we will receive resurrection bodies like Him and inherit the earth in righteousness for the glory of God. This is our hope. It is set. Your heart can be certain. Beloved, let the hope of Christ be your anchor. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 to an inheritance that is imperish**able**, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, ⁵ who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time" (1 Peter 1:3-5).

Has something been holding you back from giving your life to Christ? Let these four blessings of Advent -blessings brought by the arrival/coming of God in Christ -- turn your heart today and ignite a flame of faith and love toward Him. LOVE, JOY, PEACE, and HOPE can be vours today in the only Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. "But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name,

he gave the right to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God" (John 1:12-13).

PASTOR'S ARTICLE

ADVENT: GOD'S ARRIVAL IN JESUS CHRIST

"Advent" comes from a Latin word meaning "coming," or "arrival." In an old Latin Bible, it was used for the future second coming of Jesus, for the resurrection and final judgment. But the idea of awaiting God to come is not unique to us. Before the first coming of Jesus, God's people were awaiting God to arrive in the Savior. They were awaiting the kingdom of God, the full blessing of the Holy Spirit, and the bringing of salvation to the nations. Praying for and waiting for the blessing of God is a great way to live!

This time of year, we remember the idea of awaiting the coming/arrival of God in the person of Jesus Christ. We remember how saints of old awaited His first coming to accomplish salvation; and we remember how we currently await His second coming to bring all things to their appointed End.

In either case, God's arrival in Christ has important practical implications for our lives. The next four sermons highlight four major implications traditionally linked with the Advent season, the season of awaiting the arrival/coming of God. They are LOVE, JOY, PEACE, and HOPE. I will summarize them here as an appetizer.

1. Love – Love means blessing rather than cursing, helping rather than harming, from a sincere heart that truly cares for someone's wellbeing. When Jesus arrived, He brought the eternal love of God by winning our salvation and saving our souls. He lived a perfect life, died a sacrificial death, and rose to eternal life to bring us to God. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him" (John 3:16-17).

2. **Joy** – Joy means inner delight and happiness that grows (continues to the next page)
