and service. Keep coming to witness and experience the and experience the work of God in your local church.

4. CLEAR THE PATH. Remove any outward or practical obstacles to doing #1-3. This will mean making changes. We have all had to make practical changes in our priorities, hobbies, and schedules to go after God and seek to learn and do His will. What will this look like for you? Looking back, by God's grace, I gave up my Sunday morning shift at work so that I could come to church and hear God's Word. I stopped hanging out with certain friends. I stopped engaging in certain activities. If we want change, we have to make changes. Those things did not save me, make me a better person, or make me more spiritual! NO! They were simply the removal of practical obstacles to seeking God. These were early steps of embracing God's providence in my life. What steps will you take? What obstacles can you remove? What changes do you already know that you need to make as you seek God from a sincere heart?

5. ASK. Ask your questions. If you are learning the Bible and seeking God, you will definitely have questions. Ask one of our pastors in person or via email. We are here to help you. Our calling is to help people come to God, live for God, and grow in their relationship with God. Everyone who seeks God has questions; please do not be afraid or intimidated to come and ask. God has put us here to serve you in spiritual matters.

6. PRAYER. Begin crying out to God in prayer for help, wisdom, and guidance. When we first start praying, we do not know how to do it or what to ask for. When I first began praying, I simply called out to God for HELP. I pleaded with God to help me even though I did not fully grasp what He was doing or what I needed from Him. Jesus knows what we need better than we do. He sees our hearts, knows our sorrows, sympathizes with our weaknesses, and He sincerely desires to help us. As you LISTEN more and more to God through the Bible, be sure to also TALK more and more to God through the avenue of prayer.

7. URGENCY. Consider the importance and urgency of things. We are dealing with eternal, not temporal things; spiritual, not physical things; heavenly, not earthly things; and finally, personal things of the heart, not superficial things of outward religion. TODAY is the day of salvation; NOW is the time to seek God. "Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ² For he says, 'In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you.' Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6:1-2).

PASTOR'S ARTICLE

HOW TO SEEK GOD NOW

Has God been working in your life? Has He been drawing you to church and to the Bible? Has he been showing you the futility of materialism and the reality of eternity? Has God been opening your heart to matters of the soul and true spirituality? There is no time like the present to act on what God is doing by responding in faith. God draws us and calls us, but we must respond with faith in the heart. In other words, we must seek God. In this article, I want to

outline seven specific aspects of seeking God.

1. TRUST. Depend on God, not yourself. God promises, "You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all your heart" (Jeremiah 29:13). But we cannot find God based on our own strength, wisdom, or inborn spirituality. God also teaches that nobody seeks God on their own. "As it is written: 'None is righteous, no, not one; ¹¹ no one understands; no one seeks for God'" (Romans 3:10-11). Left to our own devices, we would never seek God. The good news, however, is that God will intervene in our lives and cause us to seek Him. God reaches out. God shows up. God draws us to Himself. So, as you embark on seeking God, you must seek Him by trusting in His providence and guidance, not trusting in your religion, feelings, intelligence, or good deeds.

2. RECEIVE. Bible, Bible, Bible, Bible! Begin to saturate yourself with the Bible, God's holy and inspired Word. (A.) Keep coming to church to HEAR the Bible preached, which is the primary way God uses the Bible to give grace to our hearts. (B.) Go home and carefully READ the Bible and think about it. Practically, the way we trust God when seeking Him is to seek Him in His Word to us, the Bible. The Bible is the living and abiding Word of God to us, and through its teachings and power, God will do His work in your life and bring you into a relationship with Him. (C.) Learn as much as you can about the Bible's central message, THE GOSPEL of Jesus Christ. Only the biblical gospel can save our souls and reconcile us to God forever. "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23). We are sinners who deserve judgment, but Jesus died for our sins to deliver us and gift us the gift of eternal life. Whatever you do: LEARN THE TRUE GOSPEL!

3. EXPERIENCE. Continue to be around the Christian fellowship for encouragement in the right direction. God puts true churches in different communities to be a lighthouse and refuge for the people. We are a lighthouse of God's truth. We are living examples of helpless sinners saved by grace. We are walking and talking evidence of God's love and power. We are not at church because we are good, and we are not trying to do good to earn our way to heaven. Rather, we are at church because we are sinners in need of divine mercy, and we have already acquired access to heaven as God's gift of salvation in Jesus. He died for our sins and rose to eternal life. We put our faith in Him for forgiveness and salvation, and are depending on God to help us live for Him and grow in our relationship with Him. This is what you need to be around when seeking God. Otherwise, you might inadvertently adopt a warped idea of God, church, salvation, or Christian living. True churches are biblical communities of faith for love, learning, worship,
